Taylor-Wood's prolific career spans from high culture to pop culture. She got her start as a member of the Young British Artists—a loose group of artists who were showing their work in London in the late 1980s (think Damien Hirst and Tracey Emin)—and was most recently appointed to the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire. The exhibitions she's been in literally number too many to count and include many a Biennale and major museum retrospective (the National Portrait Gallery commissioned her to do a portrait of David Beckham), and her photos and films reside in high-profile collections the world over (Tate Modern, Saatchi, SFMOMA).



The shoot that produced this gorgeous still image of *Jonathan* also spurred Taylor-Wood's collaboration with Ivan Putrov, the lead Royal Ballet dancer who was suspended in the air as the subject of her 2004 film *Strings* (which earned her a nomination for the inimitable Turner Prize). While *Strings*, unfortunately, isn't one of those things that's all over YouTube, some of **Sam Taylor-Wood**'s other works can be found on the internet for your viewing pleasure. She directed Elton John's classic "I Want Love" video (a.k.a. Robert Downey Jr.'s comeback) and the wonderfully-dancey "Uberlin" video for R.E.M.

Just like Taylor-Wood's music video directorial efforts are easily accessible and viewable online, today's edition brings the artist's high-profile works decidedly closer to home, to you and yours, dear collectors.
